Assignment: Sample Textbook Questions "Sample Questions from the Textbook"

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Course: *MGT 360*

Title: *Management and Organizational Behavior* (3 units)

Goals:

The primary purpose of this exercise is to explore and reinforce the key concepts from the textbook, especially theory, practice, concepts, and vocabulary that students feel have been useful to them in learning about management and organizational behavior. One aspect of internalizing key concepts is to generate explicit (that is, written) sample questions directly from the assignment reading material.

A related purpose of this exercise to demonstrate, by way of practice with direct and immediate consequences, the role of articulating clear and viable performance measurement and management guidelines. As a manager, you are not only responsible for the *implementation* of performance objectives, but you are often responsible for the *formulation* of performance objectives as well. By designing good sample exam questions, you learn how to articulate such learning guidelines.

Process:

Your task is to submit nine sample exam questions from the textbook. The allocation of chapters to students will be done in class. Each student will be assigned two chapters. You submit five questions from the first chapter (generally a chapter before the midterm) and four questions from the second chapter (generally a chapter after the midterm). I want you to submit questions that, in your view, have been the most rigorous (difficult) or the most relevant (important) in your reading of that specific textbook chapter. Please use the exact format below, including identifying the textbook page number and **bolding** the correct answer

Sample Question (Chapter 1):
